The most interesting places are

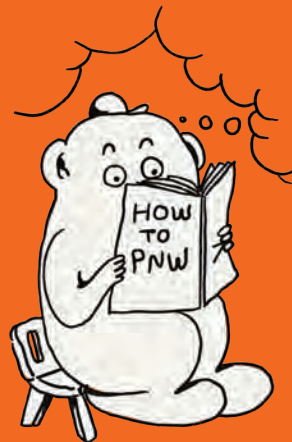
the hardest to describe.

1 Boeing Future of Flight Museum & Boeing Factory Tour

Let your imagination soar through STEM learning and next-level exhibits. Boeing's immersive aviation experience awaits. Follow up by touring the largest building in the world by volume. Fun fact: all of Disneyland can fit into the Boeing Factory!

3 Downtown Snohomish Shopping & Dining

Adorable, walkable downtown with red bricks, a river, boutiques and antiques. Good coffee. You have a new favorite town.

5 Mukilteo Lighthouse

This historic lighthouse is super photogenic. Plus, there's fish and chips and ice cream and beer nearby. Perfect.

2 Mountain Loop Highway

All the hikes, all the time in the heart of the Cascades. 60 miles of rural road. Explore the mountains and rivers that make the Pacific Northwest famous.

4 The Everett Waterfront

Modern dining, fresh seafood, hot coffee, strolling, and bicycling on the second largest marina on the West Coast. Views of the Olympic Mountains and Puget Sound islands.

6 Centennial Trail

A 30-mile path connects Snohomish to Arlington via Lake Stevens. Great for biking, walking, running, longboarding and, yes, rollerblading while listening to a Walkman.

Modern whale watching ships provide quiet tours that take visitors close to grey whales and orcas. Learn more about these gentle giants who call our waters home.

7 Take a Ferry Ride

8 Hibulb Cultural Center

Experience the folkways and artifacts from the Tulalip Peoples who have called our county home since time immemorial.

10 Highway 2 Roadtrip

Follow this scenic byway as it runs parallel to the Skykomish River on its way to Stevens Pass. Stop in the towns of Monroe, Sultan, Startup, Gold Bar, or Index to experience the authentic PNW.

biking in snohomish county



Travelling on two wheels?

Perfect. You're our kind of person! Here are some detours that will take you on local cycling adventures to remember.

The Centennial Trail

A 30-mile paved path that goes from Snohomish to Arlington. Find trailheads in Snohomish, Pilchuck, Machias, Lake Stevens, Getchell, and Arlington. The Snohomish and Arlington downtowns have bakeries, diners, boutiques, antiques, and all the smalltown charm you can handle!

The Interurban Trail

This path connects Everett to Seattle via Lynnwood. 31 miles of urban path with some surface street navigation. Explore Lynnwood for great international dining and/or connect to the Light Rail at the Lynnwood Station to take a train to Seattle and beyond.

The Milltown Trail

A 7-mile paved path around the peninsula of North Everett. This trail runs along the Everett Waterfront and offers interpretive signage about the mills that used to define the city. Stop downtown for dining and coffee afterwards.

Whitehorse Trail

A partly-paved 27-mile gravel path that runs from Arlington to Darrington along the Stillaguamish River Valley. Gravel bikes and mountain bikes are the best bet; it can be rough going for road bikes. Stop at swimming holes along the way.
